
As the mornings begin to feel cool and crisp, we sense that Fall

weather is not far away. The experts are beginning to project the peak times for **Fall** colors, and tourists have made their plans for **leaf**-peeping. It won't be long before the vibrant shades of **yellow**, **orange**, and **red** cover the mountains around us. For many people, the weather and the beauty make **Fall** a favorite season. As we notice these changes, we admire God's creation and give thanks to God for such beauty and intentionality.

These **leaves** that are changing color are actually returning to their natural color. They are not naturally green. The green color develops from the trees producing Chlorophyll. As the days get shorter, the trees do not get enough sunlight to make this food for themselves. They stop producing Chlorophyll, and the green color fades away, revealing the true and natural color of the leaves.

A Little Advice from Nurse Dora HEARING LOSS and DEMENTIA

Hearing is the sense that connects us to other people and the world around us. The loss of hearing can make some situations frustrating, or lead to isolation and withdrawal. Research from Johns Hopkins reveals that hearing loss is linked with walking problems, falls and even dementia. As you walk, your ears pick up subtle cues that help with balance, and hearing loss mutes these important signals.

Studies have also found an association between hearing loss and the development of dementia in older adults. It has been found that mild hearing loss doubles dementia risk, moderate hearing loss triples the risk and people with a severe hearing impairment are five times more likely to develop dementia. Brain scans have shown hearing loss may contribute to a faster rate of atrophy in the brain. Hearing loss also contributes to social isolation and a lack of engagement in conversation, both of which may contribute to dementia.

Nearly everyone experiences hearing loss from time to time. Common causes include a buildup of earwax or fluid in the ear, ear infections of a change in air pressure. A mild degree of hearing loss is an inevitable part of the aging process.

If you suspect you are losing your hearing, you should see a doctor who specializes in hearing disorders. And if a hearing aid is recommended, you should be aware that research has shown that using a hearing aid may help slow the development of cognitive problems as we age.
