#### Our Free Food Pantry & Market Celebrates 1 Year!

Through our partnership with Manna, FAUMC started the market to address the unfortunate increase of food insecurity in and around Hominy Valley.

Our first food pantry/market took place on November 18, 2022. We had around 480 pounds of food and served 15 households & 59 people. Our December 2022 market served 8 households & 22 people. Last month's October market served 41 households & 135 people, and we hand-



ed out almost **2000 pounds of food!** Over the year we have expanded our market to include not only food, but household items, personal care, baby items & even pet supplies. We have shared wonderful moments and met neighbors who have come to rely on

our market to help offset the rising costs of food.







#### UNDERSTANDING PARKINSON'S DISEASE

Parkinson's disease is a disorder of the brain which causes unintended and uncontrollable movements of the body such as shaking, stiffness and difficulty with balance and coordination. These symptoms occur when nerve cells in an area of the brain that controls movement become impaired and/ or die. Early symptoms of the disease are subtle and usually begin gradually and worsen over time. These symptoms include involuntary shaking or tremors of the body, slow movement, and stiff and inflexible muscles. Symptoms may also include depression, anxiety, loss of sense of smell, problems sleeping and memory problems. As the disease progresses, people may have difficulty walking, talking, chewing and swallowing. They may also have mental and behavioral changes, fatigue, irregular blood pressure, urinary problems, constipation and skin problems.

Although most people with Parkinson's first develop the disease after age 60, about 5% to 10% experience onset before the age of 50. Early onset forms of Parkinson's are often, but not always, inherited.

Many people with Parkinson's disease note that prior to experiencing tremor and stiffness, they had sleep problems, constipation, loss of smell, and restless legs. While some of these symptoms may occur with normal aging, talk with your doctor if these symptoms worsen or begin to interfere with your daily activities.
