

The Gospels are full of stories of Jesus sharing meals with disciples, friends, even tax collectors and Pharisees. Whether multiplying bread to feed a whole crowd, relaxing with his inner circle, or telling curious elites stories about even greater banquets,



Jesus imparts wisdom as he shares the wine and grants forgiveness as he distributes the fish. This resource provides biblical insights along with thought-provoking queries regarding our own time, such as whom should we invite to Sunday dinner and who is left out and left behind in our culture today.

Jesus was often at or near a **table**. He accepted dinner invitations, ate in mixed company, miraculously fed thousands of people, told parables about banquets, and even hosted a sacred **meal** that we now call "The Last Supper. For thousands of years, disciples have gathered to break bread together in his memory, believing that he is in our midst. Still today, we acknowledge that there is something special and particular about being together at a **table**.

Our theme for the season of Lent this year will be "Meeting Jesus at the Table." I will be using a book of the same name, by Cynthia M. Campbell, in my sermon preparation. This year, Lent begins on February 14. Before the Ash Wednesday service that night, you are invited to an Italian dinner. Invite a friend or neighbor to join us for a meal as we give thanks for God's amazing love and set a table where all are welcome.

As we observe this season together, we will host a Monday night study that will read and discuss this same book. We will also schedule a trip to visit Haywood Street Congregation's welcome table and worship service. Finally, as our Lenten practice this year, we will work together to help put food on our neighbors' tables. Each Sunday in Lent, you are invited to bring items to support the free monthly food pantry/market hosted at Francis Asbury UMC.

February 18 (Lent 1): Cereal February 25 (Lent 2): Toilet Paper March 3 (Lent 3): Canned Fruit

March 10 (Lent 4): Ready to eat soup/stew/chili

March 17 (Lent 5): Instant Mashed Potatoes
March 24 (Palm/Passion Sunday): Paper Towels

March 31 (Easter): Canned meat (ham, chicken or beef)

As we journey through these 40 days, you may discover other opportunities for gathering, sustenance, service, and renewal around **tables**. I look forward to this season together, where we will renew our call to discipleship, encounter Jesus, and journey toward

resurrection.

LOVING OUR NEIGHBORS...

FAUMC started our monthly MANNA food pantry/market to assist with the unfortunate increase in food insecurity in and around Hominy Valley. Our first market took place on November 18th, 2022. Early on, we averaged around 500 pounds of food monthly and we served an average of 30 people. The market has grown and changed so much since

the beginning! **In 2023**, FAUMC serviced a total of **1050 people**, with an average of 96 people per market. We now regularly serve around **1300 pounds of food per month**.

Over the year we expanded our **market** to also include household items, personal care, and even pet supplies. Many of our markets also include a yard sale area, where we offer clothing and other things at no charge. Our largest to date was in November 2023 where we assisted 148 people. In December, we created a mini-shopping area that included things that could be used and given as Christmas gifts. Toys, candles, socks, mittens, scarves, etc.

The market is not just a place where we give as a congregation, but a place where God shows us His light and love. For example, in the Fall we did back-to-school backpacks for children. One of the kids we offered a backpack to told us "No, it's ok, I have a backpack in the car. Give it to someone who needs it." When helping load the car after the family shopped, our volunteer noticed the little girl's backpack was falling apart. That volunteer went back in and got her a new backpack. This act of selflessness showcases the attitude of so many who join us every month. In July we had a shopper who took a 24-count cupcake tray that we later learned she distributed to the homeless. Many of those who shop with us regularly bring books, toys, and other items for us to give away as a way to say thank you. (We of course always tell them it's not necessary.)

We have gotten to know many new friends in the community through our **market**. We have heard stories of heartbreak and struggles, and seen firsthand Hominy Valley's perseverance. We have been able to offer comfort, and sometimes even hugs, to those dealing with health issues and loss. We have given out more than food, we have created a safe space where people are not judged and many times can leave with a smile.

We want to once again give a special thanks to all the volunteers who have made this outreach possible, we appreciate each of you very much!

FEBRUARY IS AMERICAN HEART MONTH What to Know About Heart Attack

In the United States, someone has a heart attack every 40 seconds, or about 805,000 people in the course of a year. Of these, approximately 375,476 die from the attack.

So, what exactly is a heart attack? A heart attack occurs when a blood clot blocks blood flow to an area of the heart, and without blood, some heart tissue dies. The amount of heart tissue that dies may be very small, or it may be very large and cause sudden death. The symptoms of heart attack vary greatly from person to person, but usually includes pain or tightness in the chest, neck, back, jaw or arms, as well as abnormal heartbeat, anxiety, shortness of breath and lightheadedness.

Once a heart attack is suspected it can be confirmed or ruled out by a blood test called a troponin test. Troponin is a protein that is released into the bloodstream by damaged heart muscle. If troponin is found in the blood, it indicates a heart attack has occurred.

Treatments for heart attack range from lifestyle changes and cardiac rehabilitation, medications, stents and bypass surgery.

So if you suspect a heart attack, the goal is to minimize damage to the heart by getting medical help as quickly as possible.
