

A Little Advice from Nurse Dora THE HEALTH BENEFITS OF FORGIVENESS

When you are hurt by the actions or words of another person the wounds can leave lasting feelings of resentment,


bitterness, anger, and even hatred. But if you hold onto that pain, you might be the one who pays most dearly. If you are unable to find **forgiveness** you may become depressed, irritable or anxious, feel at odds with your spiritual beliefs, bring anger and bitterness into relationships, or find you are unable to enjoy the present.

Forgiveness means different things to different people. But in general, it involves an intentional decision to let go of grudges, bitterness, resentment and anger. Forgiveness is a commitment to change and it may take some time and some practice. By choosing forgiveness you can embrace peace and hope and experience physical, emotional and spiritual well-being. Forgiveness can lead to improved mental health, less anxiety, and stress, fewer symptoms of depression, healthier relationships, improved self esteem, lower blood pressure, a stronger immune system and improved heart health.

So, when someone you care about hurts you, you can choose to hold onto anger and resentment, or embrace **forgiveness** and move forward. **Forgiveness** brings a kind of peace that allows you to focus on yourself and helps you to go on with life.



The United Methodist Church General Conference

Within the United Methodist Church, the General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the international denomination. The General Conference typically gathers every four years; however, because of the worldwide pandemic, the conference that had been planned for 2020 was postponed. Therefore, our denomination has not held a



General Conference for almost eight years. The next General Conference meeting will be April 23 – May 3, 2024, in Charlotte. Our Annual Conference is one of the host conferences. North Carolina has a chance to welcome, and host, United Methodists from around the world. Attending the conference are 862 voting delegates – half clergy and half laity. They represent Annual Conferences in Africa, Europe, the Philippines, and the United States.

During their gathering, General Conference delegates: approve a budget for denomination-wide ministries around the globe; elect members of the Judicial Council; approve theological statements; and consider legislative petitions submitted by organizations, individuals, and Annual Conferences. They will also worship together daily. As the conference takes place this month, we are invited to:

- **Pray.** Pray for the delegates who will travel to Charlotte, for volunteers, for discernment, and for United Methodists around the world. Resource UMC has put together a devotional and prayer guide (similar to the Upper Room Daily Devotional) which you can access at: https://www.resourceumc.org/en/content/guide-to-prayer-for-the-united-methodist-general-conference. *Copies available in the church office*.
- **Stay informed.** Follow the events of General Conference through reliable new services such as The United Methodist News Service (https://www.umnews.org/). Many of the sessions, including worship, will be live-streamed.

One of the treasures of our denominations is our connectedness, which we see in our local churches, our Annual Conferences, and our General Conference. I am grateful to be connected with you, as we Praise God, Grow Spiritually, and Reach Neighbors here at Francis Asbury UMC.
