They came to the edge of the village where they were headed. He acted as if he were going on but they pressed him: "Stay and have supper with us. It's nearly evening; the day is done." So he went in with them. And here is what happened: he sat down at the table with them. Taking the bread, he blessed and broke and gave it to them. At that moment, open-eyed, wide-eyed, they recognized him (Luke 24:28-31, The Message).

For 40 days of Lent, we are studying and encountering Jesus at the

table. We have examined Gospel stories in which Jesus **dines** with pharisees, sinners and tax collectors, friends, enemies, disciples, and seekers. We have examined parables that Jesus told about hospitality, mercy, and the kingdom of God. Our theme has inspired memories of meals we have shared in the past, and those with whom we have shared them. It has challenged us to reconsider acts of hospitality and welcome, and to consider ways that tables and meals can transform hearts, lives, and relationships.

On Easter, we will recall the story of two disciples on the road to Emmaus, filled with grief and disappointment after the death of Jesus. Having journeyed with the resurrected Jesus for an afternoon, it is only at the table that they recognize him. Jesus blesses and breaks the bread, and serves them. The **Communion table** will be set on Easter Sunday, and we will be invited to the meal where Jesus is the host, and where his grace is given to and for us.

As we journey toward Easter this month, we will continue our Meeting Jesus at the Table study on Monday nights. We will offer our monthly market on March 21st, and continue to bring items each Sunday to help put food on the tables of our neighbors. On March 27th, Francis Asbury will host our first Welcome Table meal in four years. During Holy Week, we will share dinner together and experience worship together at the table as we remember how Jesus spent the last night of his earthly life. We trust that Jesus will meet us at the table, and wherever we mav be.

I am grateful to be with you on this journey as we praise God, grow spiritually, and reach In Christ's Love, **Pastor Avery** neighbors.

A Little Advice from Nurse Dora THE IMPORTANCE OF VITAMIN D, THE SUNSHINE VITAMIN



Vitamin D is a nutrient that is essential for life. It is vital to bone health, muscle movement, nerve connections to the brain, and immune system function. It also protects us from infections and diseases like cancer, cardiovascular and respiratory diseases, diabetes and dementia. Vitamin D helps our bodies absorb other nutrients such as calcium and phosphorus which are both important for bone health. Without sufficient vitamin D, our bones can become weak and fragile.

The primary source of vitamin D is sunlight. Our skin produces vitamin D after sun exposure, depending upon the sun's intensity and angle. People who live farther from the equator, such as in the northern part of the

United States find the sun's rays are less effective, especially in winter. When sunlight is optimal you need 20 minutes of exposure per day. If you are over age 70 you may need more than 20 minutes because your skin does not make vitamin D as well as it did when you were younger. After getting vitamin D from the sun or a supplement, it must be activated in the body in order to work. This process involves the liver and kidneys and may not occur if kidney or liver disease is present.

There are few foods, other than fish, that contain vitamin D unless it has been added to the food. Orange juice, milk, yogurt and cereal are often fortified with vitamin D.

How do you know if you are deficient in vitamin D? Ask your doctor about doing a blood test to check your vitamin D level. Your lowest level is likely to be in the middle of winter. Vitamin D plays an important role in health, and vitamin D supplements are readily available to help correct any deficiency that may exist.
