We continue to support ABCCM and Food Connection, supply local schools with **groceries** for students and their families, and host our **monthly market**.

The season of Advent begins on Sunday November 30th. This is the four-week season of preparation leading up to Christmas. This season brings with it many opportunities for worship, fellowship, special events, and service. As we have done previously in Lent, we are going to be intentional in giving to our FAUMC monthly market during this season. We invite you to bring items for our pantry each Sunday, and on Christmas Eve:

Dear Francis Asbury United Methodist Church,

Four months ago, we launched our "Forward in Faith" capital campaign to update the flooring in two of our buildings. We celebrate that phase one of our capital improvement project was completed in September. The fellowship hall building, including the nursery, children's church room, hallway, and bathrooms, has received new flooring. It was a joy to see that space filled with neighbors as we celebrated FAUMC's 120th anniversary on September 21st. Thank you for your generous support that


made this possible!

As with past capital campaigns, our church leadership has made a commitment to tithe ten percent of the project cost to missions. We believe whole-heartedly that this is a part of our faithful stewardship. Our Church Council has selected organizations to whom we will donate our tithe. The tithe for phase one is designated for our Western North Carolina Annual Conference's Disaster Ministries. On September 28th, the 622 churches in our annual conference contributed to a special offering to support the repair and rebuilding of several churches that were severely damaged by Hurricane Helene. Our tithe is going to that fund. As we tend to our campus, we support our sister churches in tending to theirs. We believe that the church is the people. We also believe that our church campuses and buildings are significant resources that support ministries, mission, and hospitality.

Phase two of the project is projected to begin in early 2026, likely in March. This includes the Mildred Howard building – the gym and accompanying bathrooms on the lower level. The estimated cost is \$34,687.95. Our tithe for phase two is designated for Manna Food Bank and for a scholarship to the Ferguson Family YMCA's "Camp Kiddos" hosted on our FAUMC campus next summer. We are grateful for our partnerships with both organizations, serving neighbors and families together. Manna Food Bank, which serves sixteen counties in Western North Carolina, has seen a significant increase in need this year. In June, their community markets were visited more than 190,000 times – the highest number in their forty-two year history. We feel called to support their good work, as they support our monthly market, which is held in our church gym.

Our "Forward in Faith" capital campaign will continue through December 31, 2026, with a total financial goal of \$65,000. To date, \$31,030 has been contributed. We thank you for your faithful and generous support of FAUMC as we invest in our church's future. We stand on the shoulders of our spiritual mothers and fathers who came before us, and we are committed to following their example in planning for the generations who will follow us. In all things, we seek to live into our mission: *Praising God, Growing Spiritually, Reaching Neighbors, rooted in Christ our Foundation*.





A Little Advice from Nurse Dora MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT NOW THROUGH DECEMBER 7th

Now is the time to compare your options for next year's Part D Medicare drug plans and your Medicare Advantage options. Even if you are happy with your current plan, it is important to check for any changes that may be in effect for next year. It is also a good idea to check the drug formulary for next year to make sure all your drugs are covered. And also, check the provider network if you have an Advantage Plan to make sure all your healthcare providers are still in the network for next year.

You can visit Medicare.gov/plan-compare to compare all your coverage options and also to check the star ratings to compare the quality of the different health and drug plans. You can compare the benefits and costs in your current plan to other options available to you. Look at the "Total Drug & Premium Costs" rather than just the premium cost. Update your drugs and pharmacies in order to get a better estimate of your prescription drug costs. Your costs can vary depending on the pharmacy you use, so it is a good idea to enter several pharmacies to see which ones are "preferred" and which ones give you the lowest cost. It is also a good idea to enter your plan's preferred mail-order pharmacy as this will usually be your lowest cost option for 90-day supplies of the drugs you take on a regular basis.


The FAB Women are delighted to host our annual Ladies Advent Tea, a cherished tradition that brings warmth and reflection to the season.
